

DER SLOPE CONTRACT LET

TERPULSE, Ore. (Special to Observer)—The contract for construction of the new Alder Slope ditch was awarded Tuesday night to the Enterprise of Baker, W. A. Bishop of Enterprise will do the work using teams and scrapers and to be finished by July 1. In the event of this summer's season.

On the basis of contract prices, estimated that the ditch will cost \$4800. To this is to be added the cost of bridges and \$2000 for right of way, and engineering, bringing the total amount up to \$16,000.

Four contractors bid on the job, Bishop, J. Newberg of Portland, Andy Ross of Enterprise and the Shaver of Union. Bishop and Newberg were very close together and the directors of the company decided between them until Bishop cut his price slightly to get the job.

The ditch will be about seven miles long and will carry water from the Wallowa river and Hurricane creek around the slope at a level considerably lower than that of the present canal. The new ditch is to be built by the Alder Slope Ditch company which also owns the upper canal, and so both are part of a single plan for adequate irrigation of one of the best favored districts in the county.

Abundance of water is assured by the ditch from its new sources and it also will receive the waste water from the upper ditch. It will carry an additional 200 acres bringing the total of the district to 4100.

The ditch company is a corporation with one share of stock issued to each acre of ground watered. Ed Gillespie and S. O. Gates are president of the company and O. D. Shaver, secretary. The company has prepared preliminary estimates and is the engineer in charge of the construction.
