Crew Flees as Historic Ship Burns at Portland

PORTLAND, Ore. Apr. 12. (AP)—The river steamer Diamond, one of the historic boats of the Upper Columbia traffic, formerly the Dulles City was destroyed by fire here last night as she lay at her berth in the river. The fire is believed to have started in the engine room.

Members of the crew, five men and a woman cook, were driven to the stern by the flames and were forced to climb down over the steamer's wheel to escape the flames.

The loss is estimated at \$75,000, covered by insurance.
