ANNOUNCE NEW AUTOMATIC PLANT

Northwest District Managers have just returned from Dayton, Ohio, where they have been attending the Tenth Anniversary Delec-Light and Frigidair sales convention which was held in that city April 8 and 9 and in which 1500 members of the field organization of the Delec-Light Company took part, according to Mr. Jesse Rosenbaum, local dealer, who was visited by the Spokane manager this week.

An important feature of the convention, said Mr. Rosenbaum, was the announcement by the company of a new model, completely automatic Delec-Light plant. This plant does not have the usual storage battery. It starts automatically, whenever a light is turned on or any electric switch is closed, and it stops when the light is turned off or the other electric service is ended.

This plant is especially adaptable to the automatic electric service required for the operation of electric pressure water systems and of Frigidair, the electric refrigerator.

Tentative plans for the still greater expansion of the Delec-Light Company at Dayton, were outlined by Alfred P. Sloan, Jr., president of the General Motors corporation, who was a guest of the convention and who declared that the companies of General Motors were back of any plans of the Delec-Light Company, its subsidiary, to make and to sell, in still greater numbers, Delec-Light products to the highest possible quality and at the lowest possible price.

The Delec-Light Company now has in Dayton, said Mr. Rosenbaum, the largest factory of its kind in the world, covering 22 acres of floor space and their plans for expansion are based on indications that in 1926 there will be bought at least twice the number of their products that were bought in 1925.—Adv.
