

LEWIS VISITS IN BOISE, IDA.

BOISE, Ida., Apr. 16. (Special)—M. P. Lewis, of La Grande, Ore., found a new and strange Boise on his arrival here for a second visit.

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after 61 years. Mr. Lewis, who is attending a conference of insurance men, last visited Boise in 1865. "Boise impresses me as a coming city," said Mr. Lewis, "for when I first visited here in 1865 it was a mere village, with but little promise of its present development. The town then was a typical western city. Wide open, with saloons and gambling places everywhere, it presented an activity which was characteristic of the cities of the pioneer western period."

"I recall that there was a good deal of freighting done to the mining districts, and the loading of the wagons and pack horses presented a busy scene in those days. Can't find landmarks."

"The city, with its imposing business houses, well kept residence districts and modern appearance, looks little like the Boise of that time. The old Overland hotel was the principal hostelry then, and I have been unable to locate its site. "Oldtimers of Boise have largely passed from the scene. As there was no railroad into Boise, we had to stage. John Halley was the stagecoachman, and I used to come in

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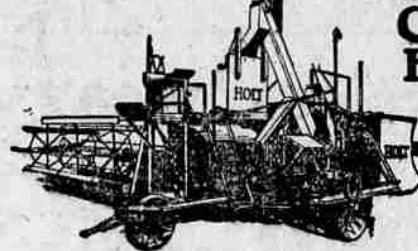
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
