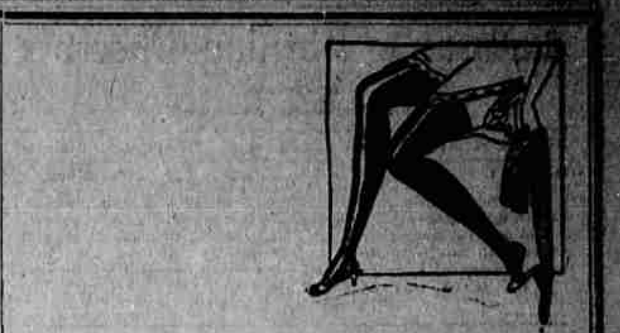

Sister Mary Says:
(BY Sister Mary)
Breakfast—Baked apples with cereal, thin cream, fish omelet, corn bread, maple syrup, milk, coffee.
Luncheon—Tomatoes in rice border, radishes, whole wheat bread, jelly, milk, tea.
Dinner—Pot roast of beef, brown gravy, mashed potatoes, buttered parsley, stuffed celery, chowchow, bread pudding, graham bread, milk, coffee.
A piece of beef cut from the round makes a delicious pot roast. If you have an iron kettle with a tight fitting iron cover no water need be used in the cooking. Near the meat on all sides, then cover and cook over a low fire for several hours, depending of course on the size of the roast. The meat actually cooks in its own juice and is as tender as tender can be. The fish omelet uses any fish left over from the preceding dinner.
