In the name of the State of Oregon, you and each of you are hereby required to appear and answer the Complaint filed against you in the above entitled Court and cause, on or before six full weeks after the date of the first publication of this summons against you, and if you fail so to appear and answer, or want thereof the plaintiff will pray the Court for judgment and decree against you as follows:

That the plaintiff have judgment against the defendant Anna Oliver for the principal sum of \$2500.00, together with the principal sum of \$87.50 with interest thereon at the rate of 8 per cent per annum from and after March 8th, 1925, and for the further principal sum of \$87.50 with interest thereon at the rate of 8 per cent per annum from and after September 8th, 1925, for the further principal sum of \$17.50, together with interest thereon at the rate of 8 per cent per annum from and after March 8th, 1926, and further for interest at the rate of 8 per cent per annum on the original sum of \$2500.00, from and after the 8th day of March, 1926, for the further sum of \$400.00 as a reasonable attorney's fee herein, and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements incurred in this suit.

That the sums of money above set forth be decreed to be a good, valid and subsisting lien upon the premises described as follows, to-wit:

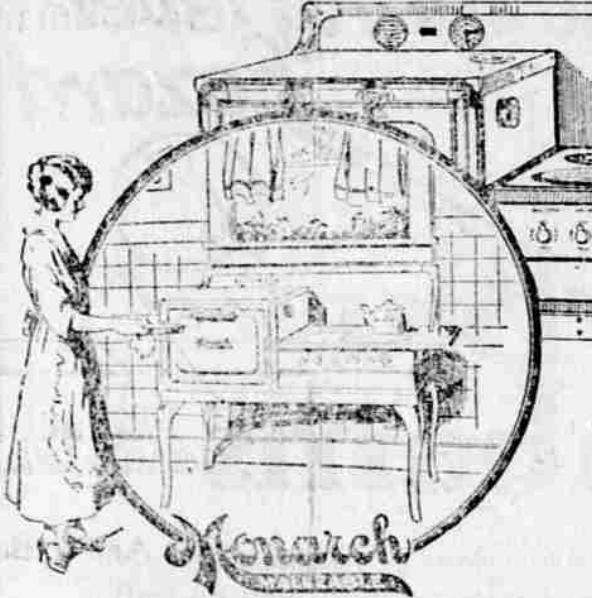
