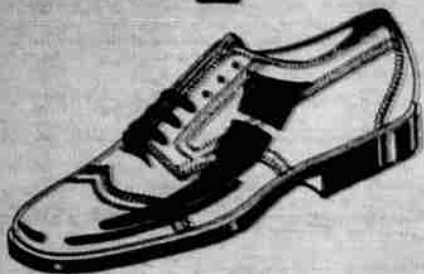

Stock Market Moves Upward Again Today

NEW YORK, Apr. 22. (AP)—Constructive forces were at work in today's stock market which again moved under the leadership of the railroad shares. With freight car loadings and bank earnings showing an indication of any marked depression in business and first quarter earnings reports generally favorable, operators on the long side found plenty of ammunition in their campaign to restore speculative confidence. The senate's approval of the Italian debt settlement, bright prospects for an agreement for the funding of the French debt, removal of merger legislation by railroad executives, the department of justice's approval of the Tiltwater-Associated Oil merger and the continuance of some money rates all helped to create bullish sentiment.

The closing was strong. Total sales approximated 1,700,000 shares.

NEW POTATOES GO ON MARKET

New potatoes, shipped here from California, made their appearance on the local retail markets today, selling at 18 cents a pound or two for 35 cents. But house lettuce jumped from 25 to 35 cents today, cabbage dropped to five cents a bunch, strawberries fell to 30 cents a box and chard raised to six cents a pound.

BUTTER MARKET SHOWS STEADIER TONE; EGGS OFF

PORTLAND, Ore., Apr. 22. (AP)—The local butter market is showing a steadier tone at the lower level. There is a brisk demand for extra and extra extra a half cent higher on the exchange at 15 1/2 cents. Other grades remain unchanged. Receipts are still liberal with 24,875 pounds in yesterday together with a load make of 29,000 pounds.

Egg receipts have fallen off considerably during the last few days and as a result the market is strengthening. Receipts are up a half cent on the exchange at 24 1/2 cents; other grades remain steady. Total receipts yesterday in this market were 1725 cases.

Choice HBE and soft at 14 cents along the street this morning with extra fancy extras going even higher or in occasional cases. Receipts were light and the demand good. On the other hand, country dressed hogs are showing a slightly easier tone although top pork still brings 19 to 19 1/2 cents.
