CORN PLANTING TIME VARIES.
 Corn planting time is best changed in Oregon to suit the season, says the experiment station. Planting usually done from mid-April to the warm parts of southern Oregon and the Columbia and Snake valleys to May 29 in the Willamette valley and June 1 in the higher altitudes. This season is early and no the above dates can be moved ahead slightly. Too early planting in cold soil or with a great deal of danger from frost is not recommended.
