Home Pointers

Windows are made bright and shining with little effort by washing them clean with warm water to which a tablespoon of ammonia has been added.

A good proportion in leavening is two teaspoons of baking powder to 1 cup of flour without egg. One egg is equal to one-half teaspoon baking powder so if the recipe calls for one cup flour and 1 egg, then 3/4 teaspoon of baking powder is enough.

Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary) Breakfast—Stewed dried apricots, cereal, thin cream, cornmeal pancakes, maple syrup, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Creamed eggs on toast, peanut butter bread, sandwiches, shredded fresh pineapple, maple syrup cake, milk, tea.

Dinner—Hotpot of hodge podge, buttered carrots, prune and cheese salad, lemon cracker pudding, granham bread, milk, coffee.

No special dishes need be prepared for junior members of the family with the exception of crisp toast for breakfast in place of the pancakes suggested.

Maple Syrup Cake

One and one-fourth cups maple syrup, 6 eggs, 1 cup pastry flour, 3/4 teaspoon cream of tartar, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla.

Separate whites from yolks of egg. Beat whites of eggs until stiff using a wire whisk. While beating whites cook syrup until a firm ball is formed when several drops are tried in cold water. It will take about as long to cook the syrup as it does to beat the egg whites.

Slowly add cooked syrup to whites, beating constantly and until the mixture is cool. Beat yolks of egg until thick and lemon colored, using a Dover beater. Beat yolks into first mixture. Mix and sift flour, salt and cream of tartar. Sift six times. Fold into mixture carefully. Turn into a tube cake pan and bake one hour in a slow oven. Invert pan to cool.

This cake requires no icing.
