(By Sister Mary) Breakfast—Baked eggs, cereal, thin cream, crisp graham toast, marmalade, milk, coffee. Luncheon—Oyster stew, crisp crackers, pickles (for adults), rice bread and peanut butter, sandwiches, pineapple souffle, milk, tea.

Mixed Carrots and Peas: Six or eight new carrots, 4 tablespoons butter, 3 tablespoons sugar, 2 tablespoons orange juice, 1 tablespoon minced mint leaves, 3/4 teaspoon salt, 2 cups cooked peas. Scrape carrots and cut into slices one-half inch thick. Cook in slightly salted boiling water to cover for 15 minutes.
