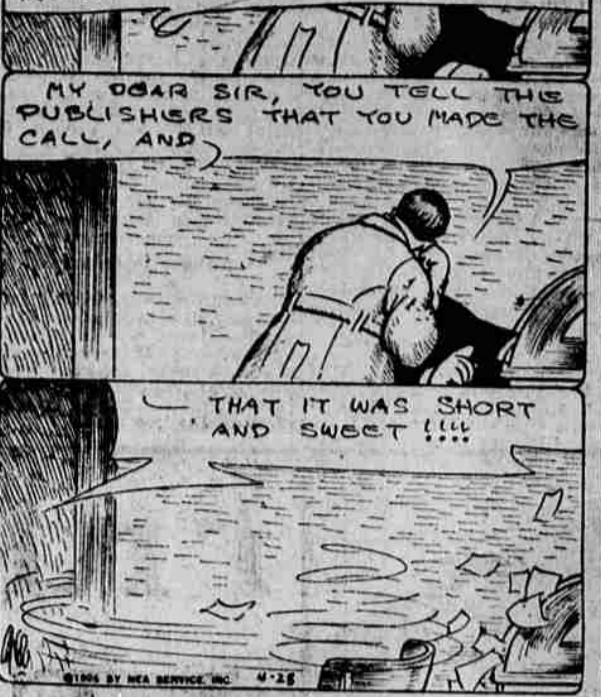

"Grand Duchess" Film Is Comedy Success

The latest comedy opus from the Paramount organization, "The Grand Duchess and the Waiter," which is the attraction at the Arcade theater today and Thursday, may well be characterized as a triumph.

It is certainly a triumph for Malcolm St. Clair, the rising young directorial genius, who has taken this frisky French stage success by Alfred Savois and transferred it to the silver sheet with the real confidence of a De Mille and the Continental sophistication of a Lubitch.

It is a decided triumph for Joseph Monjou, whose smooth and polished performance of the wealthy Parisian boulevardier masquerading as a waiter is the finest exposition of screen artistry the current season has produced.

It is assuredly a triumph for Florence Vidor, who looks ravishingly beautiful in her French hold and startling array of fashionable gown creations, and who plays the role of the haughty and fascinating Grand Duchess with the charm and poise and consummate skill of a seasoned trouper.

These two, Monjou and Miss Vidor, hold the center of the stage throughout the unrolling of the picture and provoke a continuous succession of laughs and chuckles. The plot, though of light substance, has been so deftly handled by St. Clair that it becomes a matter of considerable interest in itself and keeps the audience wondering how it's all going to end.

The action hinges on Monjou's experiences as a waiter and later as a member of the Duchess's personal staff. The idea of falling in

love with a servant is unthinkable to the Duchess, and yet there is something about Monjou that piques her curiosity and stirs her emotions. But the waiter's suave love-making finally sweeps away all her fears. Even then her pride prompts her to run away, but a persistent search and a complete explanation bring happy results.

Roughnecks Act In Peters Film At Star

Fifty of the roughest, toughest men in motion picture captivity worked with House Peters in making "Combat" at the Universal studios. This picture will have its local premier at the Star theater on Thursday, when it starts a three-day run.

Besides the tough characters to play lumberjacks that were taken to the northern part of California when the company left for location, an additional five backwoodsmen were brought back to the studio to finish the picture.

The story is a typical out-of-doors, he-man picture of the type that has made Peters famous. It is said to be so tough that even the film won't burn, with a thrill in every foot.

European Stars Will Compete in A. A. U. Meet

NEW YORK, Apr. 28. (AP)—Sten Pettersson, Sweden's great hurdler, and Ugo Frigerio, Italy's little walking champion, will participate in the national track championship at Philadelphia July 2 and 6. Acceptance of invitations has been received by the Amateur Athletic union.

Pettersson has beaten the world's record time for the 400-yard hurdle.

Frigerio came to the United States a year ago last winter and participated in several indoor races. He is the 16,000-meter champion of the Olympics.
