Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary)
Breakfast—Oranges, cereal cooked with dates, thin cream, soft cooked eggs, crisp bran toast, milk, coffee.
Luncheon—Spring rice, rye bread, lemon sponge pudding, milk tea.
Dinner—Planked whitefish, martique potatoes, buttered new beets, jellied cabbage salad, strawberry fluff on sponge cake, bran rolls, milk, coffee.

The easiest way to cook a fish is on a plank. There is no difficulty in transferring the fish to a plank without breaking its shape. The paring of the "planked fish" may be as elaborate as the cook desires but the actual cooking of the fish is as simple as broiling a steak. Always grease the plank well, then lay the fish, split and with backbone removed, skin side down on the plank. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and dot with fat. Bake in a moderate oven about 30 minutes. Garnish with a border of beets and potatoes and sprinkle with minced parsley and add wedges of lemon wherever most attractive.

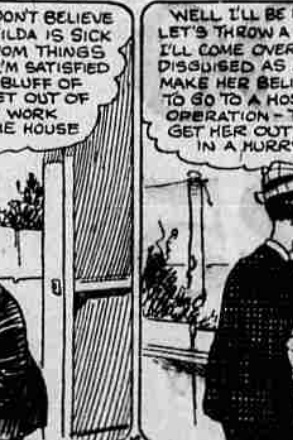

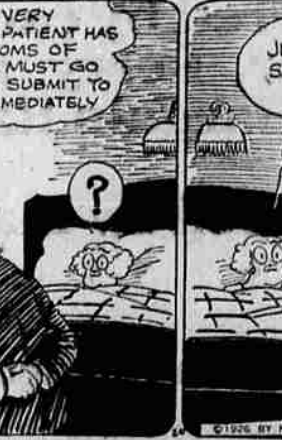
