

## REBEL PLOT IS UNCOVERED

CORK, Ireland, Apr. 26. (AP)—An American, giving his name as Patrick Garland, has been arrested on a charge of assisting in the organization and maintenance of an illegal military force and with conspiring for the overthrow of the Free State government. He was taken before District Justice Patrick O'Sullivan today for arraignment.

Garland was arrested Tuesday when he arrived at Queenstown aboard the S. S. Adriatic. His address was given as New York city.

The police said that when he was arrested a mass of republican correspondence was found concealed around his waist and that drafts on an Ulster bank for \$4,000 also were found.

The prosecuting counsel regarded the arrest as of the gravest

importance to the Free State. He said that the documents found on the prisoner showed that negotiations were being carried on in the United States for the purchase of machine guns.

The authorities say that attempts of the kind disclosed in the communications found on Garland were exceedingly dangerous and that conviction could be punishable by death.

## Sleuths Searching for Los Angeles Bank Man

BALTIMORE, Md., Apr. 29. (AP)—Baltimore hotels have been canvassed in an attempt to trace J. O'Neill, former Los Angeles bank teller, believed to have mailed \$151,000 in Liberty bonds received at the treasury in Washington. O'Neill and \$175,000 in bonds disappeared simultaneously from the First National Bank of Los Angeles. The bonds were mailed anonymously to the treasury and bore a Baltimore postmark. Detectives did not disclose whether they had established O'Neill's presence here.

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## Linn County Man Files Against Ballot Title

SALEM, Ore., Apr. 29. (AP)—Wayne Anderson, of Linn county, has filed a petition in circuit court here attacking the ballot title prepared by the attorney general covering the initiative bill proposed by the state grange on the hydro electric water and power state indebtedness amendment. The petition avers that the title is unfair in that it places the indebtedness feature of the amendment first when that is not the main purpose of the amendment. The same petitioner a few weeks ago attacked the ballot title prepared for the other hydro electric bill and secured a revision of it in circuit court here.

SAN BERNARDINO, Cal. (AP)—In a dying statement Sydney Ashford, 24, of Colton, absolved his wife, Leonora, of responsibility for a fatal gun shot wound. He died shortly after his wife was taken into custody on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon. Ashford said he was shot when he attempted to disarm his wife who he feared would harm herself. She has not been informed of his death.

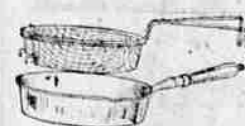
