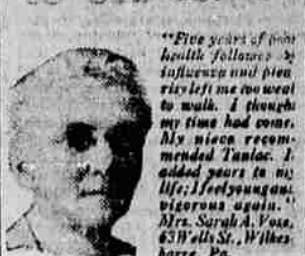

LIME RATE REDUCED

SALEM, Ore., May 3. (AP)—The public service commission has authorized a reduction in the freight rate on lime rock from Wilderville to Salem from \$2.50 to \$2.05 a ton. This rate will be applicable only to lime rock shipped from the quarry in Josephine county to the state penitentiary plant in Salem in car lots of 50,000 pounds minimum to be manufactured into lime for agricultural purposes.

In addition to the reduced rate on the raw product the commission has authorized the application of the special low rates on agricultural lime from Salem based on the scale of rates used out of Gold Hill before removal of the lime plant from that place to the penitentiary.
