Pendleton statistics show a loss of 475 voters during the two years period. The democrats have gained from 2354 in 1924 to 2444 this year. The republicans have decreased from 7,463 in 1924 to 6937 this year. Prohibitionists have 42, socialists 53, independents 140, and miscellaneous 55.
