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CONVICTS KILL GUARD, ESCAPE

JOLIET, Ill., May 5. (AP)—Deputy Warden Peter Klein of the Stateville Penitentiary was beaten to death by seven convicts in a prison break today, the first escape from the great steel modern prison. The convicts escaped in an automobile, after leaving Klein in a cell.

The convicts, three of them serving life sentences for murder and the other four serving long terms, took with them a guard named Keely.

Keely had taken the seven to the assistant warden's office in a

solitary cell house to be disciplined. Keely is believed to have taken a post at the door.

A few minutes later the men emerged, cowed Keely into walking with them a half mile across the prison yard, unlocking the big gate and leaving with them. They fled in warden J. L. Whitman's automobile.

Klein's body was reached with difficulty because the escaping prisoners took the key to the solitary cell house. When the door was smashed he was found dead from a beating and stab wounds.

All of the escaped convicts were from Chicago.

The prisoners wounded Jacob Judnich keeper of the solitary cell house. Besides Keely they also took James Cassidy, a trusty prisoner with them.

Strike Summary

(By the Associated Press)

Disorders in the form of sporadic rioting in many places throughout the United Kingdom marked the second day of the Great Britain general strike.

There was some mob fighting, apparently not carried on by the strikers. In the rougher sections of London, jitney drivers were attacked by rowdies in Newcastle, Liverpool, Dundee, Nottingham, Glasgow, Leeds and Stoke-on-Trent and in some of these places gangs clashed with the police.

Home Minister Sir William John-son-Hicks indicated in the house of commons that the government was prepared to use troops if necessary to maintain the vital services.

The naval force in the Clyde at Glasgow has been augmented by the big battle cruiser Hood, pride of the British navy and strong naval forces also are at Liverpool. Destroyers have been sent to Newcastle and Middlesbrough to cope with any difficulties.

Neither side has shown any signs of weakening and both denied current reports that any peace overtures had been started. Lord Birkenhead announced in the house of lords that the government would not negotiate as long as the general strike continued.

A typical London fog added to the congestion of motor cars in the narrow streets.

The trades union congress, welcoming good wishes from the president of the American federation of labor expressed confidence of winning the strike.

British members of the national sailors' and firemen's union, now in American ports have been instructed to await the result of a strike ballot which will not be known until the end of the week, but 46 members of the engine room crew of the White Star liner Arabic attempted to leave the ship at her New York pier today.

Will Submit Bill for Relief of 2 Counties

SALEM, Ore., May 5. (AP)—The county courts of Marion and Unadilla counties, by a bill which will be submitted to the next legislature by the state board of control, would be relieved of the expense of officially committing to the state insane hospitals Oregon citizens who are adjudged insane in other states and deported back to this state. Dr. H. E. Lee Steiner, superintendent of the state hospital for the insane here, today requested that such a bill be prepared and the board agreed to it.

Dr. Steiner said that the fact that a person has been deemed insane by a court in another state and committed to a hospital should make it unnecessary for the procedure to be repeated in this state. Because of the location of the two insane hospitals nearly all such patients now go through the county courts at Salem or Pendleton, causing considerable expense. The bill to be prepared by the state board will provide for direct commitment.

Vancouver Motorist Injured at Roseburg

ROSEBURG, Ore., May 5. (AP)—Frank Sabell, of Vancouver, Wash., was painfully injured here today, when the car in which he was riding with W. Smart, also of Vancouver, was wrecked about ten miles north of Roseburg. The car in which the two men were riding started to pass a truck and trailer. The trailer was said to be working back and forth across the highway and in trying to pass, the car was pulled too far to the left, striking the shoulder of the highway. The machine could not be pulled back on the pavement and went off the grade, striking a telephone pole and tearing off the top of the automobile. Mr. Sabell was thrown out of the car and fell on his face, breaking his nose and cutting and bruising his head. His injuries are not of a serious nature but will keep him confined to the hospital for a few days.

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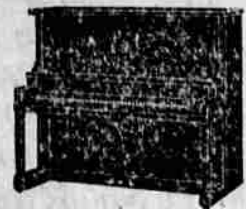

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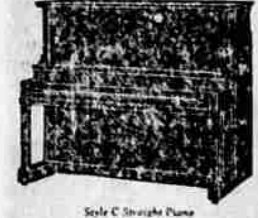

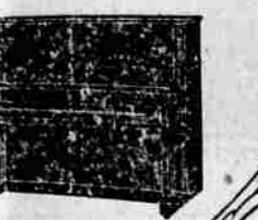
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
