Denny Is Funny in Comedy with Laura La Plante

With the market saturated with so-called "polite comedies," it is a relief to finally find one that really is worth while. Such a picture is "Skinner's Dress Suit," a Universal-Jewel coming to the Arcade theater Friday and Saturday.

It is a cute story taken from the famous book of the same name by Henry Irving Dodge and it has been capably directed by William A. Seltzer, famous for his deftness and facility of direction.

"Skinner's Dress Suit" tells the story of Skinner and "Honey," his wife. He is an underpaid clerk while she, loving him madly, can think of him only as a power in the business world, held down only by fate and lack of opportunity.

Through his wife's constant impatience, Skinner finally plucks up enough courage to ask his employer for an increase in salary. It is refused. Unwilling to dampen his wife's spirits he tells her that he has gotten a ten dollar a week raise. She immediately makes plans to spend the money in advance from their joint savings.

"Honey" makes him buy a dress suit. That begs further expense for accessories. They begin to be invited around. They must take dancing lessons. New furniture is necessary a radio and other things.

That's when the fun begins. Poor Skinner is hounded by his creditors at the most important moments. "Honey" happily ignorant of the woe that is to befall her, is willingly brought her husband, is supremely joyous at their improved social status.

It would be a shame to spoil the climax of the picture by divulging it here. Sufficient to say that there is a surprising and unexpected denouement.

Reginald Denny is ideally cast as the hapless Skinner. Sweet Laura La Plante is perfect as "Honey" and the rest of the players occupy their rightful niches.

The cast, aside from the principals, include Ben Hendricks Jr., E. J. Hatchler, Arthur Lake, Holdu Hopper, Lionel Brahm, Betty Morrissey, Henry A. Barrow, William H. Strauss, Lila Leslie, Broderick O'Farrell, Lucille Ward, Lucille De Nevier and Frona Hale.

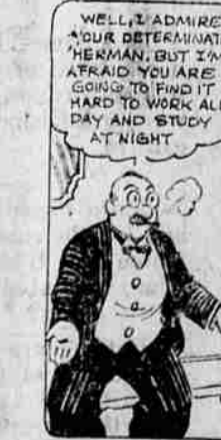
