

MEN SEEKING WET TREASURE

HENDERSON, Minn., May 14. (AP)—Forty barrels of beer, buried in a hillside sixty years ago, is the "treasure" sought by four young men of Henderson who start digging for it today.

Charles Ney, owner of the brewery which was razed last summer, gave the men permission to sink a shaft in an effort to locate the beer.

Jacob Hitter, original owner of the brewery, stored the beer in a cellar thirty feet under ground sixty years ago. Soon thereafter, the tunnel leading to the cellar caved in and no attempt had been made since to salvage the beer.

Old employees of the brewery have figured out the approximate location of the beer. The youths have a rule chart showing that by digging downward for thirty feet they will enter the tunnel leading to the cellar.

They face one hazard however, in Andrew J. Volstead, author of the federal law which bears his name and legal advisor to the northwest divisional enforcement group who last autumn decided to look into the legality of unearthing the beer. His decision has not been announced.

The youths, however, have decided to proceed and await a decision later.

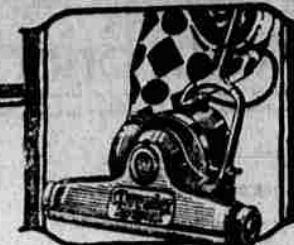

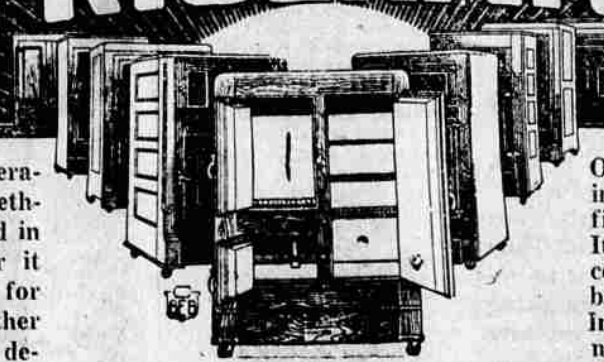
