**Reserve Strength**

"A team is no stronger than its substitutes," has long been an accepted truth.

No major league manager can hope to get anywhere, unless he has the proper reserve strength to meet the situations that are constantly arising on the ball field.

During the first week of the American League race the Chicago White Sox were minus the services of outfielders Johnny Mostil and Bill Barrett because of injuries and illness.

Mostil and Barrett are right-handed hitters who just dot on southpaw pitching. Their absence from the game made it necessary for Manager Collins to employ an outfield made up entirely of left-handed hitters.

In one series, Cleveland shot three southpaws at the White Sox and came away with as many games. The lineup of the Chicago team was too heavy with left-handers, but Manager Collins had no alternative.

A week later, with Mostil and Barrett back in the game, the White Sox routed the Cleveland southpaws who had made them look foolish earlier in the season.

In those days of intensive baseball, reserve strength is an important asset.

## RISKO BEATEN BY STRIBLING

NEW YORK, May 15. (AP)—The state of Georgia, which already boasts one newly crowned pugilistic champion in the neuro-middlesweight titleholder, Thor Flowers, today had a potential light-heavyweight king in W. L. (Young) Stribling.

Last night at Madison Square Garden Stribling yielded a fifteen and one-half pound handicap to Johnny Risko, of Cleveland, and then vanquished the conqueror of Paul Berlenbach with a dazzling attack which had Risko groggy.

Risko stood up gamely for ten rounds, but only in the last two did he make any impression on the Georgian's defense. The award of the judges to Stribling was favorably received, and the smiling victor was greeted by "Ma" and his young bride with hugs and kisses as he climbed from the ring.

To Meet Berlenbach.

Stribling will meet the light-heavyweight champion, Berlenbach, on June 10 for the title.

Stribling won seven rounds, his advantage in the fifth and seventh being pronounced. Smashing rights to the jaw had Risko groggy in the seventh.

Weights were: Stribling 174 1/2, Risko 190.

Herbie Stribling, younger brother of William L., trounced Joe Werner, of New York, in a six round preliminary. Herbie, a light-weight, floored his opponent twice in the fifth round.

SANDWICH, England, May 15. (AP)—C. G. Hezlet, former member of Great Britain's Walker Cup golf team, today won the Steorges' cup from a field which included Bobby Jones and other American stars.

His aggregate for the 36 holes of stroke competition was 158.

George Von Elm, of Los Angeles, and Robert Harris, the British amateur champion, tied for second place with 161.


