HARD ROADS CUT EXPENSES

More Than Billion and a Half Dollars Saved Annually in United States

RALEIGH, N. C., May 15. (AP)—Motorists of the United States save more than \$1,600,000,000 annually in motor vehicle operating costs as a result of the construction, since 1904, of 133,000 miles of hard-surfaced roads...

This statement featured the address Connell made before the organization's convention when it met here May 14.

"Such a saving in motor vehicle costs for the United States exceeds the annual cost of the improved highways," Connell declared. "In Pennsylvania alone an analysis of operating costs of motor vehicles proves conclusively that the construction of hard-surfaced roads has saved more than \$32,000,000 annually."

"The annual cost for each mile of hard-surfaced roads constructed in the United States under the Federal Aid system is approximately \$3500, or about \$446,000,000 for the 125,196 miles. For the gravel roads it is about \$2000 per mile, or \$265,000,000 for the 133,000 miles, making a total of \$711,000,000 annual charge for hard-surfaced and gravel roads."

"The construction of these roads saved the maintenance cost for the 286,000 miles which have been replaced, totalling \$148,000,000. Therefore, the additional annual charge due to the construction is only \$563,000,000. Deducting this from the saving in operating costs of \$1,630,000,000 leaves a net annual saving of \$1,067,000,000."

TOURIST CAMP HEALTH TOPIC

Importance of Maintaining Sanitary Conditions Along Highways Discussed.

(By Dr. Frederick Stricker) With nearly one half of the people having access to automobiles and consequently spending a considerable portion of their time on the highways of the nation, the importance of maintaining sanitary conditions along these same highways becomes self evident.

CANADA BUYS DETROIT CARS

(By Roy C. Hayes) DETROIT, Mich.—Shipments of Detroit-made automobiles into Canada have nearly doubled in the last two weeks as a result of the drop on the Canadian import duty on automobiles.

Under the new revenue bill recently passed by the house of commons, automobiles costing less than \$1200 are to be taxed at the rate of 20 per cent instead of 35 per cent as heretofore. Cars selling at more than \$1200 are to pay 27 1/2 per cent instead of 35 per cent.

Canadian manufacturers of automobiles are allowed to draw back of 25 per cent of the duty paid for materials used in the construction of the cars provided that 50 per cent of the cost of the finished product is produced in Canada.

This action by the house of commons is expected to lend impetus to automobile buying in Canada and at the same time add to the pressure on Detroit plants for American-made automobiles.

The net result promises to effect a benefit to all concerned, despite the fact that several American manufacturers have curtailed activities in their Canadian branch factories.

Anxiety of the moment is shown by some 3500 automobile dealers in Canada, who according to C. J. Brawley, secretary of the Toronto Automobile Trade association are threatened with a loss of \$5,000,000 unless some plan is evolved by the government whereby a rebate of import duty of cars bought and on hand, is made.

"I believe in free trade everywhere," he said. "The tariff is a hindrance to trade. Free competition brings healthy business."

Ford's statement was made after visiting factories of the Ford Motor company of Canada.

"These fellows over in our Canadian unit are going to manufacture more efficiently now," Ford declared. "They'll have to."

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Dodge Brothers Sales 10,000 For One Week

For the first time in Dodge Brothers history retail sales by their dealers in the United States and Canada in a single week have exceeded 10,000 new motor cars and trucks, according to L. C. Smith, local dealer.

The figures for the week ending May 1 were 10,126. Compared with the corresponding week last year the gain is 4374 or 74 per cent. The gain is 560 over the remarkable delivery record established last week.

Compared with the best week last year, that ending April 11, during which 6444 units were sold, the increase is 3482 or 54 per cent.

In addition to delivering these 10,126 new cars and trucks Dodge Brothers dealers report 2750 new signed orders for future delivery received during the week ending May 1.

Shipments of new vehicles to dealers during the week were 6660, or 1528 less than actual retail deliveries. There were in dealers hands on May 1 according to their weekly reports a total of approximately 24,000 new motor cars and trucks against which these dealers hold over 17,000 signed orders.
