SALESMANSHIP IN SCHOOLS

A big chamber of commerce is asking for a greater number and a higher type of employees with school training in merchandise salesmanship. It is sending a committee to confer with school officials about the possible expansion of salesmanship courses in the public schools and starting a course in a local college.

"Salesmanship," says the secretary of this group, "has become a profession. Those who have the right kind of talent and ability have lucrative avenues of promotion open to them. Other things being equal, the man or woman with education is most likely to be promoted."

THE DISARMAMENT PROGRAM

The preliminary disarmament conference to meet at Geneva May 18 will have plenty of difficult questions to discuss, merely in shaping a program for discussion at the big meeting to follow later.

The French government lays down these main principles: That countries with troublesome neighbors must be allowed larger armed forces than those with quiet neighbors; that the power to arm rapidly—possessed by industrial nations—serves as substitute for large standing armies; that economic power and military power by land, sea and air all must be considered.

This means evidently that France's European allies, being regarded as not "troublesome" and not industrial, should be allowed to maintain larger armies than Russia, Germany and other neighbors. Also that Germany, Great Britain and the United States, being so largely industrial, may not require so much armament as France and her particular European friends.

There is something to this argument, unquestionably. But how far the principles may be pushed is open to debate. France is preparing to argue for a continuation of her own military supremacy on land and in the air. The American delegates are expected to challenge that.
