Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary)

Breakfast—Orange juice, cereal, thin cream, rice griddle cakes, liver and bacon, milk, coffee.
Luncheon—Asparagus au gratin, lettuce sandwiches, pineapple blanc mange, milk, tea.
Dinner—Chicken fricassee, mashed potatoes, buttered carrots, radishes and onions, whole wheat bread, sponge cake with strawberry sauce, milk, coffee.

The housewife who finds it more convenient to serve her hearty meal at noon time will find the luncheon menu quite acceptable for her evening meal as if she used it as planned.

Children under school age should not be served the liver suggested in the breakfast menu and should be provided with crisp toast.

Pineapple Blanc Mange
One and one-half cups finely diced pineapple, 1/2 cup water, 1 cup sugar, 3 tablespoons cornstarch, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 2 eggs (whites).

Sprinkle pineapple with sugar and salt mixed and let stand two hours. Add 1/2 cup water and bring to the boiling point. Cover saucepan and simmer ten minutes. Stir constantly to a smooth paste with 4 tablespoons cold water and stir into pineapple mixture. Cook, stirring constantly until mixture thickens. Then cook over hot water for ten minutes longer. Remove from heat and let cool. Fold in the

whites of the eggs beaten until stiff. Turn into a mold and chill. Serve with a boiled custard made with the yolks of the eggs.

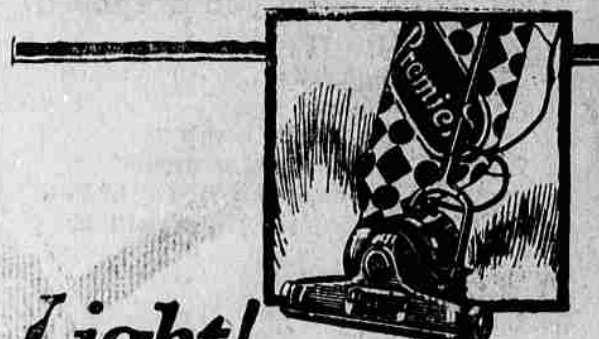
