

INVESTIGATE PRIMARY VOTE

WASHINGTON, May 20. (AP)—Expenditures on behalf of the candidates in the Pennsylvania republican primary campaign probably will be among the first to be subjected to the scrutiny of the new senate committee authorized to investigate the financial phases of all primary and election campaigns this year.

Senator Harrison charged that and Deneen, of Illinois, are the republican members; Reed, of Missouri, and Bayard, of Delaware, democrats; and LaFollette, of Wisconsin, insurgent. The Missouri democrat is expected to head the committee which was authorized to select its own chairman.

Senator Harrison charged that the "every practice which were indulged in (Tuesday) in Pennsylvania by the three candidates for the republican senatorial nomination," had been condemned in the resolution adopted by the senate when it seated Truman H. Newberry, of Michigan.

This brought a heated retort from Senator Reed of Pennsylvania, who denied there had been any corruption in the primary and asserted that the outcome hinged on the prohibition question. He held that the wet issue should not be injected into primary and election campaigns but should be submitted to the people in a referendum and in a formal statement he expressed hope that the Pennsylvania legislature would take action along this line similar to that voted recently in New York.

WASHINGTON, May 20. (AP)—Three of the five senators named to the senatorial campaign investigating committee tendered their resignations from the committee to Vice President Dawes.

They were senators Reed of Pennsylvania and Deneen of Illinois republicans, and Bayard, democrat Delaware. The members left are senators Reed democratic Missouri and LaFollette republican Wisconsin.

(AP)—The secretary of the interior has submitted a favorable report on the grant land tax bill in congress, removing the most serious obstacle to the passage of the bill, according to a telegram appointed by the County Judges' association of Oregon to work for the passage of the measure, which will return over five million dollars to the state of Oregon, being distributed among 18 counties in amounts equivalent to taxes lost on reversioned grant lands.
