"Johnstown Flood" Reproduced in Film at Star

The production of a photoplay on land or on the sea alone is a very difficult task, but when the director is confronted with handling millions of gallons of water on the land, the task is doubly difficult. In addition to this, a huge dam had to be constructed to hold the waters in check until the dramatic moment arrived. Add to this, the fact that complete cities had to be built for destruction, and you have a fair idea of what was accomplished in the filming of "The Johnstown Flood," Fox Films, stupendous drama of the shocking catastrophe which ravished the Cripple Creek valley, Pennsylvania in 1889, which is to be the feature attraction at the Star theater for three days starting today.

To film "The Johnstown Flood" it was necessary for Director Irving Cummings to have a dam, over 200 feet long and 72 feet high constructed in the California mountains. It was necessary this dam be further such as the one which burst above the ill-fated city of Johnstown. There also had to be erected replicas of the various towns in the path of the flood, principally the city of Johnstown, where the mad water took the greatest toll of life and property.

Technicians worked 24 hours daily in shifts for nearly two months planning and building the street and town sets. The dam used in the film was rebuilt from an obsolete and abandoned project.

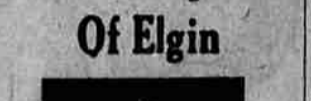
