Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary) Breakfast— Fresh pineapple, cereal, thin cream, crisp broiled bacon, soft cooked eggs, graham toast, milk, coffee. Luncheon— Creamed new onions on toast lettuce sandwiches, rhubarb, tapioca, milk, tea. Dinner— Casserole of beef with raisins, buttered rice, asparagus salad, whole wheat bread, strawberry sponge with crisp cookies, milk, coffee. Casserole of beef uses a cheap cut of meat to good advantage. The flavor is quite unusual and delicious and the raisins increase the food value. There are no dishes suggested that are not suitable for children four years of age. Strawberry Sponge One pint strawberries, 1 tablespoon granulated gelatin, 4 tablespoons cold water, 3/4 cup sugar, 1/2 cup boiling water, 1 tablespoon lemon juice whites 2 eggs. Wash berries and let drain. Press through a sieve and strain off 1/2 cup juice. Add boiling water to juice and bring to the boiling point. Add gelatin softened in cold water. Stir until gelatin is dissolved. Add strawberries, sugar and lemon juice. Let stand until cool and beginning to jelly. Fold in whites of eggs beaten until stiff and dry. Turn into a mold and put on ice to chill and become firm. Serve with a custard sauce made with the yulks of the eggs. Flavor the sauce with almond extract in place of vanilla. The almond and strawberry combination is delicious.
