TURNER LEAD IS INCREASED

PORTLAND, Ore., May 27 (AP).—It. R. Turner, of Dallas, took a lead of 176 today in the close race for the democratic nomination for superintendent of public instruction in last Friday's primary, when official returns of Douglas county added 29 to Turner's majority. This change, together with revision of Multnomah county's unofficial figures, gave the following totals:

Turner, 14,821; J. O. McLaughlin, of Corvallis, 14,645.

The Douglas correction from the unofficial figures took 88 from McLaughlin and added 11 for Turner.

ROSEBURG, Ore., May 27 (AP).—Discovery of an error in tabulation of the vote for state school superintendent on the democratic ticket gave It. R. Turner a gain of 99 votes in Douglas county, when the official count was completed this morning.

RED TO PEDDLE ICE AT WHEATON DURING SUMMER

WHEATON, Ill., May 27 (AP).—The Wheaton ice man—so far as the world at large knows the only one the town ever had—will be back on the job this summer.

Red Gange who stepped from the tail gate of a Wheaton ice wagon into the spotlight of the athletic world and thence beneath Hollywood's klieg lights is coming home to peddle ice for six weeks as training for the professional football season.

The famous halfback will leave the movie lots in July to resume the work that kept him in condition while he became the outstanding college football player of the country at the University of Illinois, from where he last fall went into a profitable career as a pro player. At present he is engaged in filming a play at Los Angeles.

"Red says he's pretty set and he's coming back to the ice wagon for what he says is the best conditioning work in the world," his father announced today.

MUSCOVITES TO AFFILIATE WITH SAMARITAN ORDER

Affiliation with the Ancient and Mystic Order of Samaritans, effective January 1, next, was voted here last night by the Improved Order of Muscovites, the play order of Oregon Odd Fellowship.

Last night's portion of the state Odd Fellows' meet, now in session here, was turned over mainly to the Muscovites. The Order of Samaritans is said to have 42,000 members in the United States.

The following officers were elected by the Muscovites to serve until the merger with the national organization is effective:

Czar, James Shannon, Oregon City; royal regent, William Morley, Hillsboro; chronicler, Jesse T. Jones, Portland; minister of finance, John Swan, Portland.

Following their business session the Muscovites conducted an initiatory ceremony which was preceded by a parade.
