Sister Mary Says

(By Sister Mary) Breakfast - Cherries, cereal cooked with dates, thin cream, sour cream waffles, maple syrup, milk, coffee.

Luncheon - Stuffed potatoes, creamed carrots, bran bread, cottage pudding with strawberry sauce, milk tea.

Dinner - Hamburg roast, browned rice, buttered spinach, banana and peanut salad, pineapple Bavarian cream, milk angel food, rye bread, milk, coffee.

Three tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 egg, 1/2 cup hot water, 1 1/2 cups flour, 2 tablespoons baking powder, few grains salt, one half teaspoon vanilla.

Creamy butter and slowly add sugar, beating until mixture is very light. Stir in a few tablespoons of sifted flour and add egg well beaten.

Strawberry Sauce - Four tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup powdered sugar, 1/4 teaspoon vanilla, 1/2 cup crushed strawberries, one half cup whipping cream.

Cream butter and beat in sugar. When white and creamy beat in vanilla and strawberries. Fold in cream whipped until stiff and serve at once.
