LIFE INSURANCE THROUGH BREAST FEEDING

(By C. Ulysses Moore, M. D., Portland, Oregon.) Member Gorgos Memorial Institute Many physical defects and illnesses of adult life may be traced to wrong diet in childhood. A right beginning is of the utmost importance.

At least 85 per cent of deaths occurring the first year of life are among bottle-fed babies. Some place the proportion much higher. Wassermann demonstrated that a drop of blood from a breast-fed infant will destroy ten times as many bacteria as one from a bottle-fed child. Recently in Paris it was found that during the summer months two hundred forty-eight bottle-fed infants died in one week as compared with twenty-six breast-fed ones—a ratio of 19 to 1, thus confirming, by statistics, the laboratory findings of Wassermann.

Danet and M. Hirsch, 6-3, 6-3, 6-2.

WOLVERTON SIGNS DECREE AGAINST OREGON GROCERS

PORTLAND, Ore., June 5. (AP)—United States District Judge Wolverton late yesterday signed a decree that restrains the Oregon Wholesale Grocers' association from conspiring or unlawfully combining in restraint of interstate trade and commerce, and especially forbidding boycotting, intimidating, withdrawal of patronage or other coercive acts in an effort to keep competition out of state business from entering the Oregon field.

The officers of the association and the leading firms that hold membership are especially restrained from doing any of the acts set forth, and from aiding and abetting in any trade restraint efforts.
