1927 License Plates To Be Black and White. SALEMAN, Ore. June 5. (AP)—Secretary of State Koser yesterday let a contract to the Irwin-Hudson company of Portland to furnish the state 238,000 pairs of automobile license plates for 1927 and 198,000 pairs of plates for truck and trailers. The plates will be the same color as this year, black background with white numerals and letters, but will be different in design in that the word "Oregon" instead of its abbreviation "ORE." will appear. Plates provided for state county and municipally owned cars will bear the letters E, indicating that they are exempt from the license fee. Plates for for-hire passenger vehicles will bear the letter C.
