Enterprise Bluebacks Return for Spawning

ASTORIA, June 7.—Returns of marked blueback salmon now being received at Astoria salmon canneries are giving one of the most impressive demonstrations of the efficacy of artificial salmon propagation in the history of scientific investigation into the commercial fisheries of Oregon.

The return is believed proportionately larger than from any other marking experiment undertaken in Oregon.

The salmon now at the canneries were liberated from the state hatchery at Enterprise, Ore., in the spring of 1924.

The fish were hatched from eggs taken at Afognak, Alaska, in the fall of 1922.

In 1925 some of the three-year-old bluebacks of this marking experiment returned to the Columbia river canneries having received some marked bluebacks while the number has been increasing materially with the development of the run.

One Astoria cannery received 382 pounds of blueback salmon Tuesday. The fish average about six pounds each.

Fort Collins School Wins National Title
