SALEM, Ore., June 8. (AP)—State Treasurer Kay Mon, reported that all counties in the state had paid the first half of the state taxes for the year by June 5, the final date provided by law for that purpose. The total amount paid was \$2,515,877.87. Of this amount the general state tax is \$1,702,474.64; the one mill market road fund fund, \$642,263.84; and the one-half mill fund for war veterans' state aid, \$271,144.40.
