WOMAN DIES IN BLAZING BERTH

LOS ANGELES, June 16. (AP)—The bodies of five persons, three women, one man and one child, were recovered late today from the burned wreckage of a Union Pacific tourist sleeper which caught fire early this morning at Crystal Sliding, 20 miles northeast of Las Vegas, Nev.

LOS ANGELES, June 16. (AP)—Union Pacific railway officials here announced today that a tourist sleeper on the continental limited caught fire at 5:15 o'clock this morning at Crystal Sliding, Nevada and that one person, believed to be Mrs. J. O. King of Hammond, Mont., was burned to death.

The continental limited, out of Los Angeles for Salt Lake City left here last night.

Officials of the company said that they had not been informed how the fire started in the sleeper which had to be cut out of the train and was destroyed. Train hands said that there was one body still uncovered in the burned car.

Mr. King, who escaped from the flaming car by jumping through a window, is an employe of the Northern Pacific railway at Hammond, Mont. Party of five passengers in the burned sleeper escaped unhurt, railway officials said.

Crystal Sliding is 20 miles northeast of Las Vegas, Nev.

PRESIDENT AND CALES EXCHANGE GREETINGS TODAY

SEATTLE, Wash. June 16.—President Coolidge and President Calles of Mexico, today exchanged felicitations over the Western Union newly established unbroken circuit between New York and Mexico City. Other felicitations over the new circuit which was established today were exchanged between Newcomb Carlton, president of the Western Union Tele-

graph company, and Eduardo Orta, acting secretary of communications and public works, Mexico City.

The message sent by Coolidge follows: "His excellency, the president of Mexico, Mexico City, Mexico: I am happy to avail myself of the opportunity presented by the opening of direct telegraphic communication between New York City and the City of Mexico, to extend to your excellency my greetings and congratulations on the inauguration of this important service which I trust will be

mutually advantageous to both countries in the promotion of their common interest. Calvin Coolidge."

PORTLAND HEARING DATED

WASHINGTON, June 16. (AP)—August 7 is the date which has been chosen for the hearing in Portland, Ore., of the railroad connection with the Interstate Commerce Commission investigation into the operation of the motor buses and trucks. Commissioner Enoch and Examiner Flynn will conduct the hearing which among other things, will

develop the extent to which motor passenger vehicles are affecting the business of the railroads.

TWO TO DRAW LOTS

Benson and Edward Dunagan, who tied with 23 votes each for one of the democratic nominations for representative from Marion county in the next legislature, will appear before him and draw lots to see who gets the nomination.
