"Rainmaker" Is Vivid Race Track Picture

A poignant, human drama, graphically developed, convincingly portrayed and intelligently directed is "The Rainmaker," the new Paramount picture, which opens a three day run at the Arcade theatre today. Film fans with a penchant for red-blooded entertainment will be more than delighted with this Clarence Badger production of Gerald Beaumont's Hot Book Magazine serial, "Heaven-bent."

Romance and regeneration are the two interlocking elements in this gripping story, which has for its background a picturesque race track and a little border town in the Southwest. The action revolves around a broken down jockey and a cheap dance hall girl, whose love for each other eventually triumphs over overwhelming trials and tribulations.

"The Rainmaker" gets its title from the fact that rain inevitably comes when the jockey is riding a favorite. The race track gamblers and hangers-on regard him with superstitious awe, but the jockey only laughs and looks wise. But there comes a time when he is called upon to pray for rain to save a whole town stricken by pestilence, and, miraculously enough, his prayer is answered.

William Collier, Jr. makes the jockey an appealing figure. He arouses genuine sympathy because he plays the role with conviction, sincerity and force. Georgia Hale gives an admirable performance in the part of the dance hall girl. There is a certain spiritual quality about her acting that adds immeasurably to the reality of her characterization. Ernest Torrence is the third featured member of the cast, and his delineation of the dance hall proprietor is a masterly piece of work.

Of the many thrills that feature the production, the exciting horse race, the terrific fight in the dance hall and the tremendous cloud-burst are the most notable from the standpoint of realism.

"Phantom Bullet" At Star Is Last Word in Westerns

For sheer action thrills, originality of plot and grandeur of scenery, not to say delicious comedy, the picture now showing at the Star theater for three days is the last word in Western presentations. It is "The Phantom Bullet," a Universal-Jewel, starring "Hoot" Gibson and directed by Clifford Smith.

The star portrays the role of a cowboy, Tom Perkins, who in order to solve the mystery of his father's murder impersonates a young man from the city, delicate, gentlemanly and ultra-refined. His incongruous contrast to the hard-boiled, fire-bitten frontier characters alloy the suspense of the guilty men and justice is served, after a long and difficult series of happenings.

An ingenious twist to the plot brings into prominent position in the story, a camera and the fact that the hero is a youth who loves photography. It is because of Tom's artistic proclivities that a major crime mystery is solved. "The Phantom Bullet" brings out the very best of the famous star. 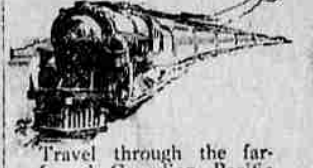

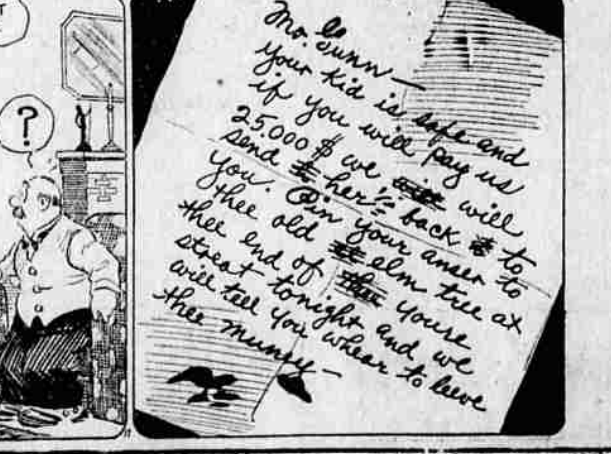

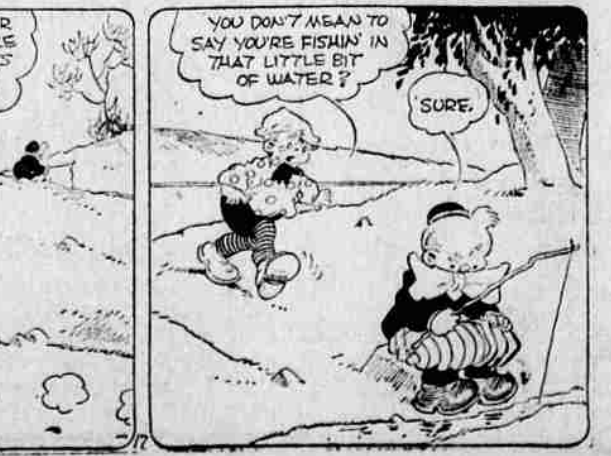
