CARL C. MAGEE IS ACQUITTED

PART LAR VEGAS, N. M. June 17. (AP)—Carl C. Magee, stormy petrel of New Mexico politics, is a free man again today. By a verdict of the court last night he was freed of the charge of manslaughter against him following the fatal shooting of John B. Laster, young highway department engineer here last August.

Laster was killed by a bullet intended for former Judge David J. Leahy, political enemy of Magee, who was one of the principal witnesses for the state yesterday. Leahy on the stand admitted that he was the aggressor in the fight that ended in Magee firing three shots. One shot killed Laster and another struck Leahy in the arm.

District Judge Luis E. Armijo by granting the defense motion for a directed verdict of not guilty, following the closing of the state

case, took the matter out of the hands of a jury composed of two men who could speak and understand English and ten men for whom it was necessary to translate every word of the proceedings into Spanish.

Heiress Will Marry Phone Co. Employee

WILMINGTON, Del., June 17. (AP)—A third heiress to the Du Pont millions will marry a poor man. Mr. and Mrs. Phillip P. DuPont, of Fairville, Pa., yesterday announced the engagement of their daughter, Elizabeth Frances, to Richmond D. Morgan, of Wilmington, a clerk in the Bell Telephone company offices in Philadelphia. Mr. Morgan formerly resided in Washington, where his father conducted an insurance business.

Elizabeth DuPont and Mr. Morgan were childhood playmates in Fairville and their engagement occasioned no surprise to friends of the couple. The young couple have been together constantly. Miss DuPont is 29 years old and Mr. Morgan is 21.

'STORK HOAX' CASE CLOSED

PORTLAND, Ore., June 17. (AP)—Charles E. Buchanan's suit to obtain damages from Dr. W. O. Spencer and from Mrs. Alta B. Y. Spalding, proprietor of the Women's hospital, in the "stork hoax" case, has failed. After long deliberation, the jury in Judge George Rowland's court brought in a verdict today in favor of the defendants, with a reprimand for their connection with Mrs. Buchanan's alleged "fake" perpetrated against her husband. Buchanan sued for \$25,000 punitive damages and \$1,911 for actual expenses of Mrs. Buchanan's trip to Portland from Raymond, Wash., in 1923, when the alleged conspiracy was entered into, and for medical attention to the child.

Both Mrs. Spalding and Dr. Spencer testified they agreed to keep Mrs. Buchanan's secret only after she had told them that, in order to hold her husband's love, she wanted to make him believe he was the father of the child.

STORE ROOM IN NEW BUILDING NOW OCCUPIED

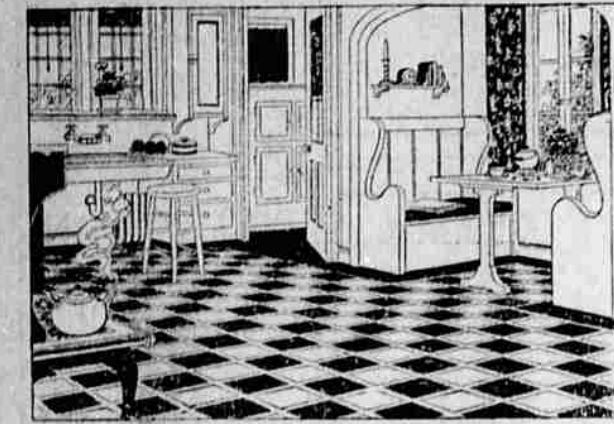
