During the program hour a musical program was given.

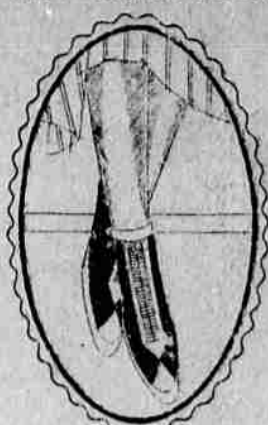
The rooms were prettily decorated for the occasion with bouquets of garden flowers. The hostesses served dainty refreshments before adjournment.

Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary)

Breakfast—Raspberries, cereal, thin cream, crisp broiled bacon, graham muffins, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Scalloped cabbage and tomatoes, brown bread, rhubarb bread pudding, milk, tea.

Dinner—Swiss steak, mashed potatoes, savory green beans, radishes and onions, strawberry Charlotte, graham bread, milk, coffee.

These menus are planned to be nourishing, attractive, easy to prepare and serve and at the same time economical. With the exception of the dinner dessert, the dishes can be prepared at a low cost. As many housewives feel justified in serving a more elaborate dinner to their families when the main part of the meal is inexpensive, the recipe for strawberry Charlotte follows.

Strawberry Charlotte

One cup crushed berries and juice, 1 lemon, 1 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon granulated gelatin, 4 tablespoons cold water, 1/2 cup boiling water, whites of 2 eggs, 1 cup heavy cream 1 dozen lady fingers.

The strained juice of berries can be used if preferred. Soften gelatin in cold water. Add boiling water and sugar to berry pulp and juice and bring to the boiling point. Remove from fire and stir in softened gelatin. Stir until dissolved. When cool stir in lemon juice. Let stand until mixture begins to jelly. Then beat with whisk until frothy. Beat in whites of eggs beaten until stiff. Whip cream firm with 2 tablespoons powdered sugar and fold with lady fingers split in halves and choice ripe berries. Carefully turn in prepared mixture and chill three hours or longer.

The Garden

LATE STARTED VEGETABLES

Vegetables have one great advantage over flowers for the home garden. There need not be so great a rush to get them going as most of the flowering annuals require a longer growing season than vegetables to produce adequate results. With few exceptions, the common garden vegetables can be planted as late as July 4 and harvest a very satisfactory crop. The exceptions are the very early crops, such as spinach and lettuce and the early radishes which spin up to seed in hot weather without tarrying to produce the desired crops. Peas also are merely a gambling chance for the late garden, the gambling being on a cool summer as peas do not stand hot weather.

But string beans, lima beans, carrots, beets, sweet corn, tomatoes, peppers, eggplants, turnips, kohlrabis, cabbage and cauliflower all may be planted with an assurance of an abundant fall garden. The care of the late-started garden will require a little extra effort to see that the soil does not dry out when the young plants are getting started, a precaution much less necessary in the wetter, cooler spring months. The main work is keeping the soil stirred frequent-

Snakeskin Jackets Show Up

LONDON, June 18.—Snakeskin spats and pocketbooks, and now snakeskin jackets have made their appearance on the Champs-Elysees and at the Longchamp races.

These startling reptilian coats which are weird enough to make any serious drinker believe his dream of pink and blue snakes have come true, are the length of a jacket and trimmed with fur at the neck and the hem. They are patterned to resemble the mottled skin of a rattlesnake, usually toned to light brown color. The snakeskin effect is produced by glazing the material.

ever allowing it to cake or crust, thus preserving the moisture by retarding evaporation.

It is well to do a little extra fertilizing in midsummer by digging in a quick fertilizer like pulverized sheep manure, a garden standby in these days of the automobile when stable manure is becoming a more and more expensive rarity. The sheep manure is easy and convenient to handle, gives quick results as well as adding to the texture of the soil.

Free use of the hose is also essential, not by way of sprinkling, but by the soaking process, removing the nozzle and letting the water run slowly and seep into the soil. This is best done in the early evening, stirring the soil the next day to preserve the moisture. A good soaking once a week will be well repaid by the vigorous growth of the garden.
