FRANCE GREET PERSHING; ACT PLEASES GENERAL

CHERBOURG, France, June 18 (AP)—An unusually cordial reception today greeted General John J. Pershing, commander of the American expeditionary forces during the World war, when he landed here today.

General Pershing affirmed the strength of the comradeship among the allied veterans in his reply to the welcome. Veteran French soldiers and Admiral De Marguerie, commanding the port, received Pershing officially, while the 15-year-old daughter of one of the leading war heroes of Cherbourg presented him with a bouquet.

"I am very deeply touched by this unexpected and cordial greeting," General Pershing told his former comrades in arms. "I am especially pleased to receive this symbolic bouquet, mingling our national colors as our dear brothers in arms mingled their blood. Yes, the old comradeship of veterans exists and will remain unshakable."
