Breakfast—Shredded fresh pineapple, cereal, thin cream, creamed fish on toast, corn bread, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—New carrot soup, croquettes, lettuce and cottage cheese sandwiches, ginger bread, milk, tea. Dinner—Hot veal loaf, creamed potatoes, beet greens, romaine salad, tapioca pudding with strawberry sauce, whole wheat bread, milk, coffee.

A meat loaf often solves the meat problem for two meals, since it can be used hot for dinner and cold the next day for luncheon. Cheap cuts of meat can be utilized if they are carefully trimmed and finely chopped. Dried bread crumbs "stretch" the meat and help to bind the loaf.

TRACK CLEAR FLAGMAN SAYS

PITTSBURG, June 19. (AP)—The Pittsburgh Gazette-Times today quotes George McConnell, brother of William S. McConnell, only surviving member of the crews of the Cincinnati limited that crashed into the Washington express near Blairsville intersection Tuesday, as saying William told him from his bed at the Latrobe hospital, that the block signal was "clear" and no red flares indicating danger ahead were visible.

A committee probing the cause of the wreck, which caused a death toll of fifteen, was told yesterday by Flagman D. S. McDonaid and brakeman T. W. Beecher, of the stalled Washington express, that flares had been placed and two block signals set, one including caution and a second a command to stop.

William McConnell was fireman on the second engine of the limited and, according to the statement credited to his brother, was at the left window of the cab watching for block signals when the limited approached gray station.

The fireman saw a clear signal, the newspaper account said, and called across the cab, "clear here, go ahead." And his brother said the engineer, who, with the crew of

the first engine of the limited, died in the crash, is said to have answered "clear here too." It was only a few seconds later, according to the re-told story of the fireman, that the crash occurred.

Former Dowager Queen Of Greece Passes On

ROME, June 19. (AP)—The former Dowager Queen Olga of Greece, grandmother of the late King Alexander and widow of King George I, is dead, aged 76, at her home, the Villa Anastasia. Members of the family were at the bedside.

Olga was dowed when King George I was assassinated at Saloniki in March 1913. She was born a grand duchess of Russia and was married to George at St. Petersburg, now Leningrad, October 15, 1867. Subsequent to the death of King Alexander, her grandson, in 1920, from the effects of a monkey bite, she assumed the regency which she held until the return to Greece of the late King Constantine. Constantine abdicated in 1922, and the republic of Greece was formed in March, 1924.

POLAND PLANS TO REMAIN IN LEAGUE GROUP

WARSAW, Poland, June 19. (AP)—Reports in Geneva that Poland was considering withdrawing from the league of nations were denied today by August E. Zajacki, the foreign minister. "The Polish government has no such desire," he told The Associated Press. "It is satisfied that Poland's just claims, upon which she will continue to insist, will be satisfied.
