BUTTER MART TURNS WEAKER

PORTLAND, Ore., June 19 (AP)—Weakness in the local butter market has become more pronounced during the last few days.

Cubes closed fractionally lower on the exchange with standards and firsts marked down a half at 37 1/2 and 36 cents respectively.

Both the local market and receipts of surplus cubes from country creameries have been heavy for the past week and it is with increasing difficulty that this surplus is kept moving.

Receipts yesterday amounted to 18,183 pounds with the local market placed at 24,139 pounds.

The local egg market is marking time with no change in prices during the closing season of the exchange.

Country dressed meats were pretty well cleaned up along the street Saturday and produce firms were figuring on little or no carry-over.

There is a good call for heavy hens and springs with offerings.

ROSEBURG, Ore., June 19 (AP)—A transient giving the name of Jack Smith is being held here on a vagrancy charge while fingerprints are being sent to Seattle on the possibility that he may be wanted there in connection with the Gaines murder. The man arrived on a morning freight, and as he answered in a general way the description of the man thought to be implicated in the Gaines murder, he was questioned by Officer Ketch. A search of the man's clothing resulted in the finding of a number of new fountain pens, apparently stolen, and his arrest followed. Fingerprints are being forwarded to Seattle today for examination there. Smith's coat bears a Seattle trademark.
