MAKING USE OF BASEMENT

There are only three ways that one can get more room without moving. One can expand outward, or upward, or downward.

New wings and additions are fine if one can afford them and if the home is laid out so that an addition will look attractive and be a real convenience. If one doesn't wish to invest in such expensive remodeling as this, the question to study is whether or not all the possibilities of the attic have been developed. If this has been done and one still needs more space, do not forget the basement.

Use Partitions.

Many times all that is needed to relieve congestion is to fit up the basement so that some of the work done on the ground floor can be performed below. If the furnace room is partitioned off so that the rest of the basement is clean, the laundry can be moved down. Closet space also can be amplified by partitioning off store-rooms below-ground.

But basements, if they are dry and well-constructed, lend themselves to other more pleasant uses. Many owners of small homes fit them up as radio-rooms and work-shops for the boys or as dancing rooms with music provided by phonograph or radio. And there's no reason why this shouldn't be done to provide more "throw room" for the whole family and to enhance the value of the property. Such a remodeling scheme can be worked out by the owner at small cost.
