Miss Bow's characterization might be termed "the metamorphosis of a flapper" for she changes from a wild, thoughtless movie actress into a loyal, sincere girl who stands ready to sacrifice her life for a friend. Warner Baxter is also seen in a new role, that of a young Kentucky mountaineer who has his own way of going after what he wants.

De Mille has handled the triangular situation in "The Runaway" with remarkable skill and makes it impossible to know before the last few minutes of the picture whether Miss Bow will choose the mountaineer, Baxter, or the wealthy young New Yorker, William Powell.

The performance of George Bancroft as a clan leader ranks on even terms with his portrayal of "The Snake," the smiling killer of Jack Palance.

The atmosphere of the Kentucky back country is maintained throughout and the naturalness of the settings lead one to believe the picture have been made in the actual locale.
