hine with cornstarch and granulated sugar mixed and sifted. Put into top of double boiler with strawberry juice. Cook over hot water, stirring constantly until thick and smooth. Let chill eight hours or longer. When ready to serve cover with cream whipped until stiff with 1 tablespoon powdered sugar and a few drops of vanilla. Garnish with strawberries and serve. This will serve ten.
