PORTLAND WOMAN FATALLY INJURED IN AUTO ACCIDENT

PORT TOWNSEND, Wash., July 5. (AP)—Mrs. J. T. Moore, wife of Captain John T. Moore, chief of inspector of the Portland police bureau, was probably fatally injured when an automobile driven by her husband slipped out of control on the Hood's Canal highway, four miles south of Port Townsend, yesterday and overturned on the highway. Captain Moore suffered four broken ribs, head contusions and bruises. Detective Robert Craddock, also in the car, received serious injuries and his wife superficial injuries. All were removed to the St. Johns hospital at Port Townsend. The automobile lost was one of three en route to the national police pistol shoot at Victoria tomorrow.
