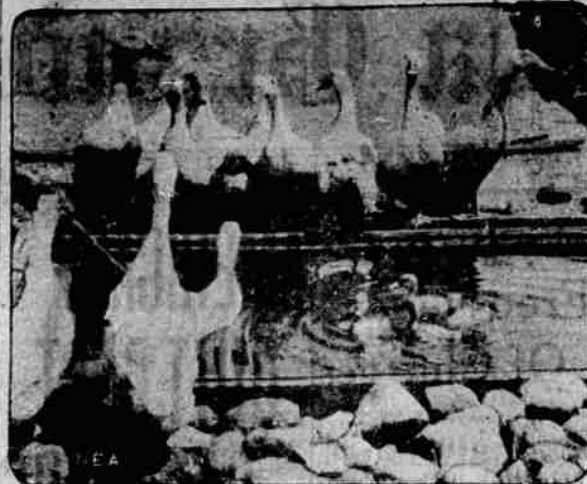
"This later devastator of the hearts of men rode the crest of the wave for some time. She seemed harmless, but she was really mischievous enough to cause a great deal of trouble.

Wendell for several years has been third string catcher and coach for the Philadelphia Nationals but was recently recalled by Cleveland.

### Farm Pointers

Incubation of eggs was shown not to be injured by loud explosions such as come from blasting in mining, land clearing, road work and firing of heavy guns, in experiments conducted by the O. A. C. station. Hatching eggs both within and outside the incubator were placed within a few feet of the heaviest gun the war department has at the college, and were later hatched out just as successfully as those kept entirely away from the firing.

Yields of fibert trees ten years old vary in Oregon groves from 10 pounds each under poor conditions to 20 pounds under good. These conditions as outlined by the experiment station are variety, location, soil and management.

Routine tests for colon bacilli in Oregon milks are not carried out because of the lack of definite standards and consequent unreliability, explains G. V. Copson, bacteriologist of the experiment station. Since it has been found that increase in colon bacteria is, according to reports, in direct ratio to increase in total bacterial count except in clean samples left standing for some time, the test for dirty or old milk is regarded as sufficiently indicative of the number of colon bacteria present.

Fumigation of Oregon prunes with carbon bisulfide is best effected by placing the fruit in a container as nearly gas tight as possible, says the experiment station, and putting the fumigant in shallow trays on top. The container is then closed tight and allowed to stand so for 24 hours. The gas, which is highly inflammable and must be kept away from fire, works best at a temperature of 70 degrees or higher.

Oregon clover affected with mildew is not injurious to stock when cut and cured for hay, reports the experiment station.

**INVESTIGATION ON PHOENIX, Ariz., July 9. (AP)—**While major interest in the McPherson abduction case was centered in Los Angeles where Angeline Temple pastor appeared Thursday before the grand jury investigating her story, officials were busy in Arizona and Mexico gathering evidence intended to throw more light on the affair. From Tucson came word that H. D. Hallenbeck, Yuma rancher and friend of the evangelist, had borrowed a sum of money from a Yuma bank on the day Mrs. McPherson disappeared. This was announced by Chief of Police Iyer who said he received such information from Ernest M. Upshaw, Oregon manager of the Wimsitt System of Banks, with headquarters in Los Angeles. Upshaw's statement of "business transactions" with Hallenbeck, however, tended to throw doubt on the previous identification of Hallenbeck by Dave Bloom, Tucson business man, as the man who purchased a panama hat in his store between June 16 and June 20; for Upshaw said that during this period the Yuma offices of the Wimsitt banks received a communication from the Yuma rancher post-marked Los Angeles.

Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico, officials investigated the story told by a Mexican wood hauler that he saw a blue automobile carrying four persons, near Nigkerhead mountain on the night of June 21, President Boulton, mayor of the city, said that the wood hauler's story checked with other details of the investigation conducted by his office. Boulton also announced that he had received a telegraphic invitation from Los Angeles to appear before the grand jury and that he would accept, taking with him Chief of Police S. Villa.

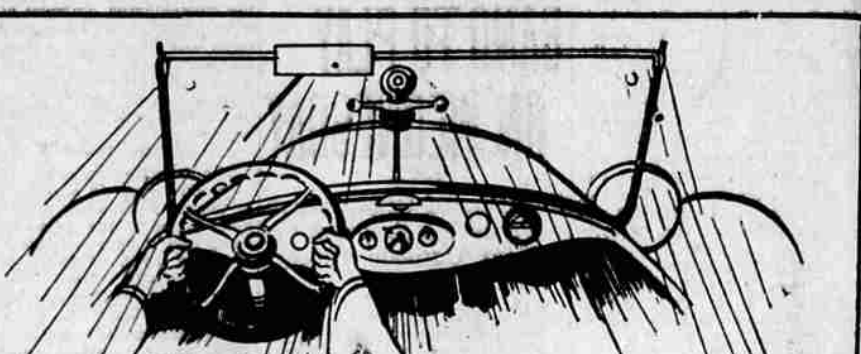
