### "Volcano" Is Playing at Arcade Today and Tuesday

In need of money, Bebe has to auction her clothes off. Beery is about to purchase them when Cortez enters and outbids him. He swears that his is a love which knows no bounds. But Arthur Edmund Carew tells Bebe that she is about to ruin the life of a man both he and she love—his brother. Bebe agrees to give him up by pretending to welcome Beery's attentions.

The rest of the picture shows how all the loose strings of the plot are cleared up. It would be amiss not to make mention of the thrilling volcanic eruption scenes which take place in the last few reels. They are really exciting.

"Volcano!" is a capably directed, well acted picture of a first stage play. It will help to pass the evening pleasantly.
