WHEAT CLIMBS SKYWARD; JUMPS 6 1/2c A BUSHEL

CHICAGO, July 12. (AP)—Wheat jumped up about 6 1/2 cents a bushel today to the best figures since February, 1916. An extremely bullish showing made by Canadian governmental crop reports was chiefly responsible together with unfavorable weather conditions both northwest and southwest. Influenced by wheat, the corn market also went soaring.

on the taxes paid in 1916, while in nearly every county taxes have increased considerably during the past 10 years. Assessors of each county will be called upon to extend the tax rolls against the O. and C. land for the years the land has been withdrawn, the same as if the lands had been in private ownership.

Will Reduce Taxes. The effect of the tax bill will be to reduce taxes in each of the 18 counties from 5 to 25 per cent. In fact, in Douglas county, it is estimated, in the event the money is used to pay off a portion of the bonded indebtedness, that taxes will be reduced approximately 27 per cent. Douglas county receiving a larger amount than any of the others affected. The tax reduction continues in the future as the bill provides that the government shall continue to advance the tax from year to year.

QUARTER LOSES CASE

SALEM, Ore., July 13. (AP)—William Quarter, who formerly was in the limelight in Portland in connection with liquor cases, and who was once the husband of Dolly Quarter who for a time was known as "queen of the bootleggers," must serve 90 days in jail in Polk county and pay a fine of \$350 as the result of a supreme court decision here today. The opinion was written by Justice Rand, affirmed the lower court conviction where the case was tried by Judge W. M. Ramsey. Quarter was charged with selling intoxicating liquor. He was arrested December 22, 1925, at Independence.

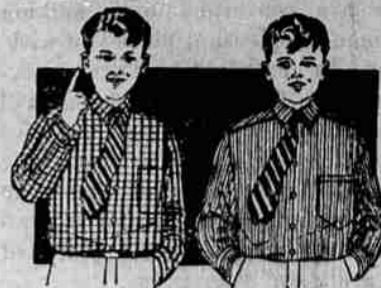
