B. F. Hummelt, who manipulates the proofs for the La Grande authorities, recently took prints of four Mexicans, all of whom were held in connection with the J. H. Pearce & Son jewelry store robbery which occurred Monday night.

Hummelt uses a pane of glass, printers ink, an ink roller similar to one used in newspaper offices in taking proof but much, much smaller, and of course, the prepared cards for the imprints.

The glass is inked, the suspect's finger placed in the black liquid, and then pressed on the card. The resulting smudge is declared a sure means of identification, as fingerprint experts insist that no two persons in the world have identical markings.

All four Mexicans peacefully

submitted to the operation. The quartet members each insisted that this was the first time, but one of them thrust his hand out like he knew what was coming.

Three Women Lose Fight For Part of \$47'000,000

Jury Decides That Alleged Heirs to Senator Clark, of Montana, Shall Not Share.

BUTTE, Mont. July 16 (AP)—Claims of Effie Clark McWilliams and Alma E. Clark Haines, of Clarksville, Mo., and Mrs. Addie L. Clark Miller, of Denver, to a share in the \$47,000,000 estate of the late Senator W. A. Clark, of Montana, were denied last night by a jury in the court of District Judge J. J. Lynch. The case has been on trial since July 1. The jury deliberated little more than an hour in reaching its decision.

An appeal will be taken at once according to Ed Hyde, of Kansas City, chief counsel for the three women.

Jury Satisfied

In arriving at its decision the jury found there never had been any marriage between the late senator and Tahitha C. Brooks, mother of the three Clarks, they alleged. Answering other interrogatories propounded by the court for determination in reaching a decision on the claims of three sisters, the jury declared itself satisfied with evidence of the marriages of Senator Clark and Kate Stuffer and Anna Luchapelle and of the relationship between the former mining magnate and the five children of his two marriages who participate under the terms of the will which had been attacked.

Claimed Descent

The suit of the three claimants to daughters' shares in the estate of the late senator was predicated on their claims that Senator Clark married their mother in 1869 in Missouri and that he deserted her and her three daughters ten years later.

determines the beauty of the dish. The texture and flavor of the vegetables must be considered since variety is important. Also the method of cooking must be considered since variety is important. One vegetable is buttered, one creamed, one baked and another fried or steamed. There is one detail to guard against—be sure none of the vegetables are too moist.

The cream sauce should be smooth and creamy, not runny, and the buttered vegetable quite dry before buttering.

Vegetable Dinner

Green pea timbales, creamed carrots, new potatoes in parsley butter, broiled tomatoes.

The dinner is planned to be on individual plates from the kitchen. A timbale is placed in the center of each plate and the remaining vegetables used as a border in groups.

Green Pea Timbales

One and one-half cups pea puree, 2 tablespoons melted butter, 2 eggs 3 tablespoons milk, 2-4 teaspoons salt, 2 or 3 drops onion juice, 1-8 teaspoon pepper. It will take about 1½ pounds of peas in the pod to make the puree.

Cook peas until tender in as little water as possible, letting the water cook away. Rub through a sieve. Beat eggs until light. Beat in remaining ingredients and turn into six buttered timbale molds or custard cups. Place in a pan of hot water, cover with buttered paper and bake about twenty-five minutes in a moderately hot oven. Unmold to serve.

Philippine Sugar Crop Drops. MANILA, P. I., July 14. (AP)—The latest estimate of the 1925-1926 cane sugar crop of the Philippine Islands is 375,000 tons, which is approximately 125,000 tons below the previous crop. Advances indicate that the 1926-1927 yield will be much larger.
