trict attorney's office had received a telegram purporting to have been sent by Ormiston which stated that important documentary evidence in connection with the McPherson case had been sent by airmail to the district attorney's office. The message was said to have been sent from "somewhere in North Carolina."

May Be in Carolina.

Simultaneously investigators have learned that a man resembling Ormiston was seen in Taylorville, N. C., for several days but left for an undetermined destination this week. The search for Ormiston led to North Carolina when authorities traced a telegram sent from here last week and addressed to Ormiston at Taylorville. The message, signed "Harry," instructed the radio man to "keep mum." It read: "Mac meet you Ocala, Florida. Tree is falling. Everything O. K. Mum the word. Appearance G. J. grand flop. Wire me under same name. Jones stands pat. A says tell Mac nothing."

Ocala, Fla., is said to be the residence of Herald McPherson, former husband of the evangelist. Investigators tonight declared that the identity of the sender was known and that he would be subpoenaed before the grand jury.

Three Confront Aimee

Three witnesses yesterday confronted Mrs. McPherson in the grand jury room and identified her as the woman they had seen at various times and places since her disappearance at Ocean Park. Mrs. McPherson was called into the grand jury room twice. The first time she stepped inside she was positively identified by O. A. Vlek, of Culver City, and his wife as the woman they saw in an auto that passed through Culver City on the afternoon of her disappearance. The couple told the grand jurors the evangelist was traveling in the direction of Los Angeles from Ocean Park. Culver City is midway between the two places.

Pape Tells Story.

Positive identification of Mrs. McPherson as a woman seen in front of the International club at Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico, shortly before her disappearance there was made before the grand jury by O. E. Pape, auto man of Tucson, Ariz., under dramatic conditions.

Pape also was reported to have partially identified H. C. Hallenbeck, confidante of Mrs. Minnie Kennedy, the evangelist's mother, as one of two men who were with

Mrs. McPherson at the time. TAYLORSVILLE, N. C., July 16 (AP)—A telegram has been in the hands of the Campbell hotel management here for more than a week, addressed to Kenneth G. Ormiston, the manager of the hotel, who said today: It was added at the hotel that no one not known there had registered a receipt of the message. J. L. James, in charge of the hotel, said he also understood a telegram had been received today by the Taylorsville police chief in connection with the case. The chief was out of the city but it could not be learned whether his absence was due to an investigation of reports that Ormiston might be in this section.
