Sister Mary Says:

(By Sister Mary)

Breakfast—Berries, cereal, thin cream, soft cooked eggs, crisp granular toast, milk, coffee.

Luncheon—Baked beef with rice, broiled bread and butter sandwiches, lemonade.

Dinner—Broiled fish, fried noodles, buttered green beans, jellied pineapple salad, cheese sticks, raspberry dumplings, granular bread, milk, coffee.

Keep in mind when broiling fish that the flesh side should be cooked first in a spit and opened fish. The skin is then cooked until the skin is brown and crisp.

Jellied Pineapple Salad

One quart can pineapple, 4 tablespoons lemon juice, 2 tablespoons granulated gelatin, 1 cup diced celery, 1 medium sized cucumber, 4 tablespoons sugar, ¼ cup cold water, ½ cup nut meats, 1 cup mayonnaise.

Drain pineapple and cut into dice. Soak gelatin in cold water for five minutes. Bring pineapple juice to the boiling point and add softened gelatin. Stir until dissolved and add 2 cups of water. Let stand until mixture begins to jelly and add lemon juice, sugar, celery, cucumber pared and diced pineapple. Fold in mayonnaise and turn into a mold. Let stand in the refrigerator eight hours or longer to become thoroughly chilled and firm. Unmold and serve on a bed of lettuce. Sprinkle with nuts before serving.

SYNOD TABLES TAX MOVEMENT

EUGENE, Ore., July 21. (AP)—The Presbyterian synod of Oregon ended its 16th annual session here last night, after making committee appointments and tabling the resolution to tax each member \$1 in order to raise money to construct an administration building at the children's farm near Corvallis.

In tabling the resolution, members of the synod explained that this tax, together with that which will be levied by the national board in raising a fund of \$29,000,000 would be too much for the church members to undertake. The national fund is to be used for ministerial pensions and the care of families of ministers.

A resolution was passed extending to Dr. Arnold Bennett Hall, president elect of the University of Oregon, the heartfelt good wishes for an administration that would be signally successful in the development of the young people of Oregon.

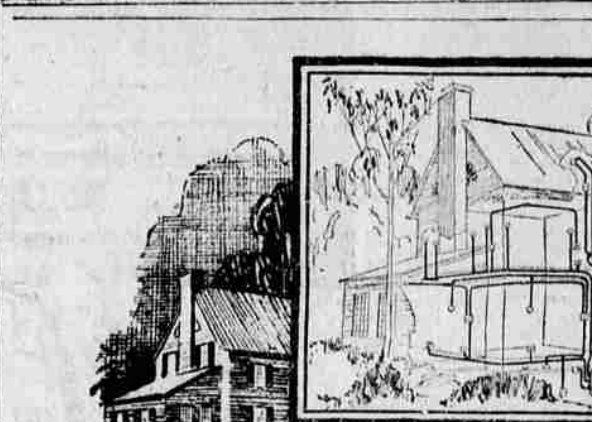
