NOT A SERIOUS MATTER.

The recommendation of the state game warden that the local sportsmen's club discontinue its annual fish feed and the decision of the club to continue the event has brought forth an editorial recently in The Oregonian.

A Union county sportsmen's organization rejected the suggestion that its annual "fish feed" be discontinued. The proposal had been tentatively advanced by State Game Warden Averill.

Let's agree that the members of the Union county organization are sportsmen in every particular, and that their ethical standards are high. But let us also agree that the state game warden knows whereof he speaks, and that there is merit in his contention that conservation should always be advanced.

The Oregonian, thoroughly believing in the soundness of sportsmen's organizations, as factors in conservation and law observance, nevertheless is of the opinion that to make a gala day of fishing, or of shooting, is questionable public policy.

There is some merit to the warden's suggestion, of course, and he is acting from a sincere motive to protect and preserve the very sport in which the local club is interested.

But banishing the annual "fish feed" is not a logical solution for his problem. Those who are familiar with the annual banquet here know that it does not encourage a fish "slaughter."

west has not been active in industrial development, but I do believe that we have been—first, more or less disposed to await the coming of outside interests to take the initiative; second, that we have failed to interest the small and moderate wealthy to any great extent in local industry and third, finance in the larger centers has not been altogether favorably disposed to aid in the development of industry in the back or interior country.

"It should be clear that what we manufacture must in a general sense compete with the same or similar articles made elsewhere, and frequently brought here at a price lower than it is possible for us to produce them at this time. Necessity insists that our energies be devoted to not only encouragement of all industry and in all sections, but requires devotion and constant thought to the establishment of industries that will convert our primary raw products into articles that can be distributed throughout the world in competition with articles produced elsewhere.

Transportation Important. "Transportation is an important item, but all may rest assured that the railroads may be depended upon to do their share.

"This is a period of decentralization of industry in the trend of events in the large eastern centers have indicated for several years past, and not only should the Northwest in the interest of the general good of all endeavor to diversify and spread out its industrial development.

CHERRIES SELL WELL IN EAST

Under the head of "Oregon Cherries Sell Well," an article in the New York market reports covering a survey by a New York writer of the cherry market as it affects the Grande Ronde valley has been clipped and forwarded to R. H. Daniel, manager of warehouses of the Cooperative Cherry Growers, Inc., of Cove.

"This city and Union are setting an example for the rest of the country in shipments of cherries to New York from the Northwest," said the writer under date of July 16. "Cherries from here and Union have been offered on the New York market the past two days through a local house there and have been topping the market daily.

"High prices on the Bing and Lambert's shipped from here are being realized in New York, despite the competition for the last week or two of locally grown fruit and heavy shipments from Yakima, Wenatchee and Hood River.

Since the eastern writer made the local survey the cherries sent out through the cooperative growers have topped the market every day, the shippers receiving an average as high as \$1 per lug more than any competitor, according to Mr. Daniel.
