Neilan used a six-ton elephant in his new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer production, "The Great Love," coming to the Sherry theater to-

day only, with Viola Dana and Robert Agnew—and here are some of the woes of the director. "Norma," the elephant, contracted colic—from being fed too many peanuts and candy by Agnew and the rest of the company. She rolled up and walled like a circus calliope.

"Norma" smelled banana oil used in the laboratory in making film cement. Perhaps it reminded her of those dear jungles—anyhow, the call of the wild lured her—and she went through several buildings before she was calmed down.

She adopted the practice of following Neilan like a dog—only she trampled the studio gardens in the process. Altogether the director breathed a sigh of relief when "Norma" was finally returned to the zoo whence she came.

The new picture is a hilarious romance in which an elephant conceives a violent passion for a young doctor who heated burns she got in a circus fire.
